

to the future of Africa. It is an initiative of the South African Institute of International Affairs (SAIIA) and the Centre for International Governance Innovation (CIGI) in Canada.

A key element in the formulation of effective national and regional policies in Africa is the ability to access and analyse a range of policy options. These are frequently produced by reputable institutions that have undertaken research on these issues and have disseminated the findings for public discourse. As a repository for policy documentation from a wide range of institutions across the African continent the **Africa Portal** seeks to be a dynamic central resource for researchers and policy formulators, and thus contribute to more effective policies being implemented. A unique element is that the Africa Portal content is primarily from African research institutions working on key African policy issues.
