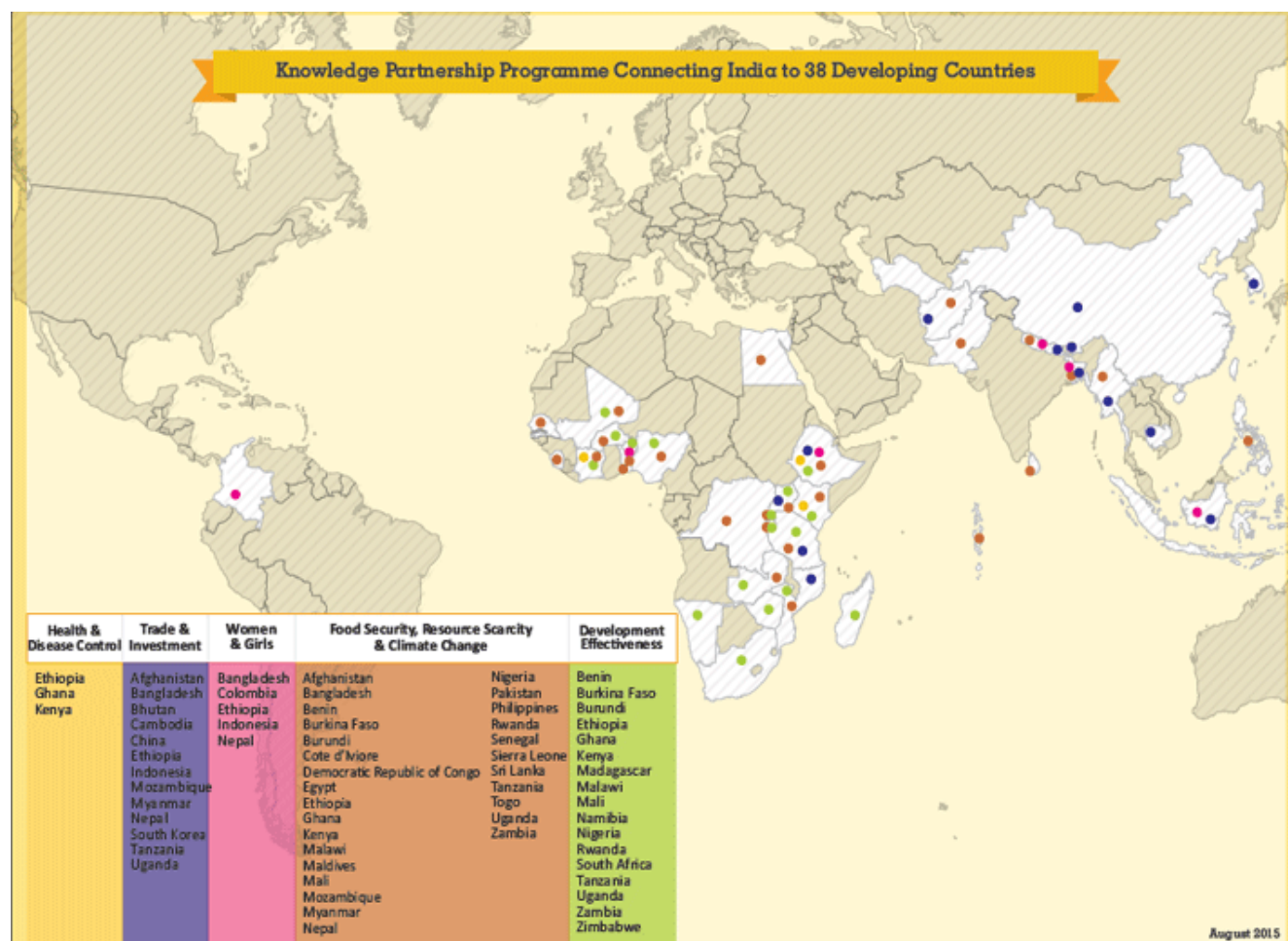

The Programme, through its various initiatives has furthered collaboration around ideas, knowledge, evidence, accountability, technology and innovation between UK, India and the developing countries of Sub Saharan Africa and South East Asia and has so far connected **India with 43 developing countries**.

Africa Capacity Building Foundation (ACBF): Established in 1991, ACBF builds Human and Institutional Capacity for Good Governance and Sustainable Economic Development in Africa. 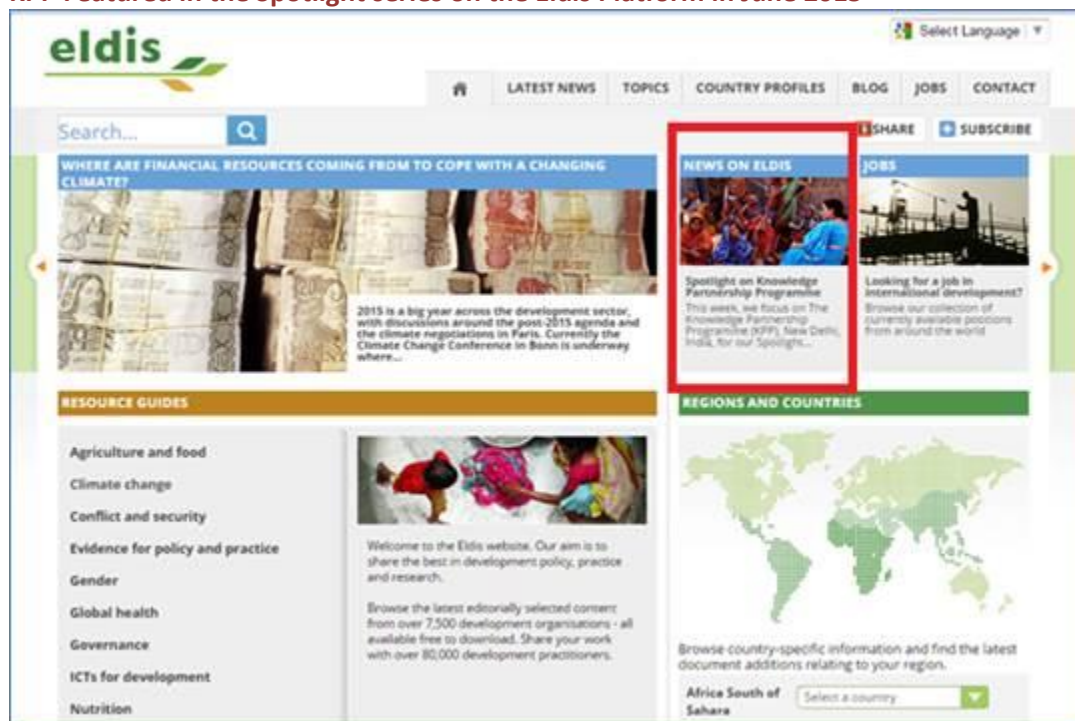
Knowledge Partnership Programme (KPP)

The Africa Adapt Network aims to facilitate the flow of climate change adaptation knowledge for sustainable livelihoods between researchers, policy makers, civil society organisations and communities who are vulnerable to climate variability and change across the continent.

AfricaAdapt is collaboratively hosted by three African organisations: Environment and Development in the Third World (ENDA-TM), Forum for Agricultural Research in Africa (FARA) and IGAD Climate Prediction and Applications Centre (ICPAC). The Network is funded by the UK Department for International Development (DFID) and the International Development Research Centre (IDRC) Climate Change Adaptation in Africa Programme.

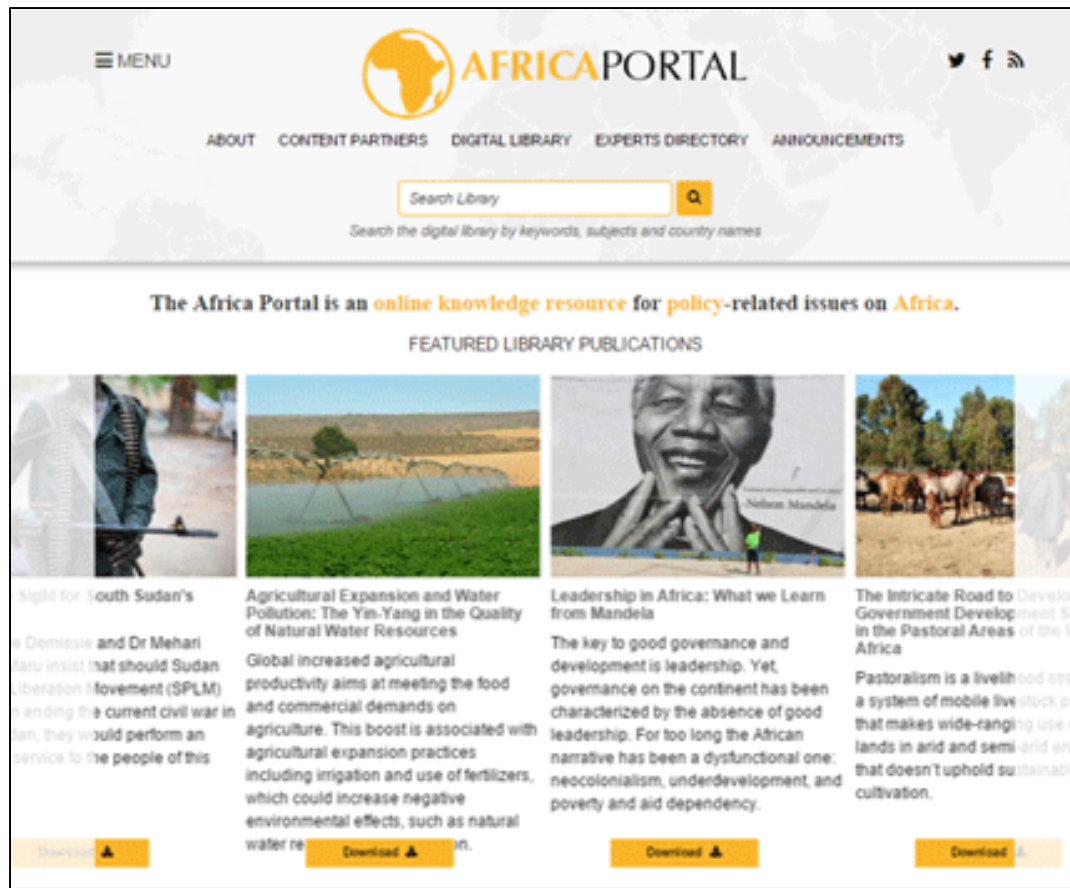

The Africa Portal: The Africa Portal (www.africaportal.org) is an online, open access knowledge resource that seeks to broaden the availability, accessibility and use of policy research on issues critical to the future of Africa. It is an initiative of the South African Institute of International Affairs (SAIIA) and the Centre for International Governance Innovation (CIGI) in Canada.

A key element in the formulation of effective national and regional policies in Africa is the ability to access and analyse a range of policy options. These are frequently produced by reputable institutions that have undertaken research on these issues and have disseminated the findings for public discourse. As a repository for policy documentation from a wide range of institutions across the African continent the **Africa Portal** seeks to be a dynamic central resource for researchers and policy formulators, and thus contribute to more effective policies being implemented. **A unique element is that the Africa Portal content is primarily from African research institutions working on key African policy issues.**
